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REMINDER: STATUTORY ASSESSMENT

RECEPTION CLASS: EYFS PROFILE

The statutory EYFS (Early Years Foundation Stage) framework requires an EYFS profile assessment to be carried out by the late June. The EYFS profile is intended to provide a reliable, valid and accurate assessment of each child's development at the end of the EYFS. It is made up of an assessment of the child's outcomes in relation to the 17 early learning goal (ELG) descriptors. The main purpose of the profile assessment at the end of the EYFS is to support a successful transition to Key Stage 1 (KS1) by informing the professional dialogue between EYFS and Year 1 teachers.

Your child will not be aware that any of this assessment is taking place – we are just sharing to let you know it is happening.

You will receive information about your child's assessment in their end of year report.

YEAR 1: PHONICS SCREENING CHECK (10/06/22)

The phonics screening check is a short, statutory assessment to ensure that children are making sufficient progress in the phonics skills to read words and are on track to become fluent readers who can enjoy reading for pleasure and for learning.

Your child will complete this check during the week commencing Monday 6 June 2022. Your child is well use to working one-to-one with teachers in school in phonics and so will probably not notice much difference with completing this statutory screening check.

You will receive the results of the check in your child's end of year report.

YEAR 2: SATS (W/C 23/05/22)

We are asked to assess the standards your child is working at in English reading, English writing, mathematics and science, by the end of Key Stage 1. To help inform those judgements, the children sit national curriculum tests in English and mathematics, commonly called SATs. The children will also be sitting an English grammar, punctuation and spelling test.

The tests are a tool for teachers to help them measure your child's performance and identify their needs as they move into Key Stage 2. They also allow teachers to see how your child is performing against national expected standards. The tests are not strictly timed for this age group and they will be completed in a way to avoid any worry.

You will receive your child's results as part of their end of year report.

YEAR 4: MULTIPLICATION TABLES CHECK (W/C 13/06/22)

Year 4 are due to have a multiplication check in June. This assessment is in the form of an on-screen check consisting of 25 times table questions. Your child will be able to answer 3 practice questions before taking the actual check. They will then have 6 seconds to answer each question. On average, the check should take no longer than 5 minutes to complete.

You will receive your child's results in their end of year report.

YEAR 6: SATS (W/C 9/05/22)

Year 6 will be taking national curriculum tests in English grammar, punctuation and spelling, English reading and mathematics. These tests will take place on the following days:

- Monday 9 May 2022 English grammar, punctuation and spelling papers 1 and 2
- Tuesday 10 May 2022 English reading
- Wednesday 11 May 2022 Mathematics papers 1 and 2
- Thursday 12 May 2022- Mathematics paper 3

We treat the Year 6 SATs as a rite of passage for our Year 6s, along with all the other experiences and fun that is on offer, particularly in the summer term of Year 6. It is important to note that our focus on learning continues right up until the end of term. We pass on SATS results and teacher assessment for all subjects to secondary schools but it's important the children keep being fully engaged learners right through the summer term, and as they transition to secondary school.

SATS results are given to the children when we receive them. Results will also be sent home as part of your child's end of year report.

Dear Parent/ Carer

The Lancashire Healthy Young People and Families Service is developing better ways to understand and support the direct care and health and wellbeing of children and young people within schools. To help us achieve this, we will be continuing to undertake the School Health Needs Assessment Programme. This allows us to assess the health and social care needs of children in Reception, Year 6 and Year 9.

A health needs assessment questionnaire has been designed in collaboration with the Public Health Team at Lancashire County Council for children who wish to participate in the school health needs assessment programme. The questionnaire is completed online (via the Lancashire County Council secure portal) in class, by your child, regarding their health and well-being. This can be viewed on HCRG's website via the following link:

The school health needs assessment programme provides vital information to help us improve the direct care and support for individual children and for the whole age group.

The Healthy Young People and Families Team review the completed questionnaires to identify children or families who would benefit from some support. An anonymised School report is shared with the Schools so they can understand their School's health needs. The anonymised information from the questionnaires also allows the health team to see any common issues that might help us improve the services we provide as your child transitions into High School. Questionnaires are treated in the same way as all children's health information and are stored confidentially in the child's health records.

We will attempt to contact you by letter if, as a result of the questionnaire, your child wishes to speak with a nurse or if our support may be beneficial. If we don't hear back from you at that time, we will offer initial support to your child but please be assured that we will contact you if there is anything that requires further discussion.
