Summary	At the start of autumn term, our reception children explore 'Who am I?' through activities and discussions that encourage self-reflection, promote healthy habits, introduce them to different homes, and celebrate family diversity. By term's end, they should understand themselves, their well-being, the places people call home, and the significance of family in shaping their identity.	This term, our reception class will explore the significance of various celebrations to different cultures and individuals. We'll learn about our grandparents' Christmas traditions and how Christmas is celebrated in Spain. These lessons will help children understand how celebrations change throughout the year and appreciate cultural diversity.	In Spring 1, our reception class will learn about lions from Africa in Geography and Science, explore African music in Music, discover silhouettes in Art, learn about animal diets and habitats in Science, and connect Literacy and Science to understand why some animals are seen as villains.	This term, we'll focus on plants in our environment. We'll explore their origins and growth needs. Children will learn to care for plants by watering, exposing them to sunlight, and nurturing them. We'll discuss different plant types globally and how weather affects their growth. Through engaging activities, children will observe and understand plant evolution, grasping the concept of growth and change in the natural world.	This term, we'll explore the fascinating world of minibeasts with the children. We'll investigate their movements, habitats, and appearances. We'll also discuss their growth and compare them to humans. Observing minibeast patterns and names will be exciting. Most importantly, we'll learn to care for our environment and feel responsible for the world around us.	In our final topic, we'll explore the importance of environmental conservation. We'll also compare our local area to the seaside, discover beach treasures, learn about sea creatures, and get creative with sand crafts. It'll be a fun and educational journey exploring the wonders of the sea and our environment.
